Johnny Paul WA5BGO, owner and operator of Austin Amateur Radio Supply passed away on December 10th after experiencing a heart attack around Thanksgiving. Johnny and Austin Amateur Radio Supply was a long time supporter of Ham Expo. As of this writing the future of Austin Amateur Radio Supply is unknown. Below is the obituary from the Austin American Statesman.

PAUL, John Edward "Johnny"

Johnny Paul of Austin, Texas, entered his Heavenly home on December 10, 2013. He was born January 26, 1939, to Bill and Alvina Paul, in Austin, Texas. He graduated from MacCallum High School in 1957. On August 20, 1960 he married Grace Elaine Buchhorn. John was on active duty with the National Guard during the Berlin crisis. After a career with NCR, John served the local Austin community for over 45 years as owner of BMS Office Supply and, later, Austin Amateur Radio. John was licensed as an amateur radio operator in 1960, with the call WA5BGO, and was president of the Austin Amateur Radio Club from 1977 to 1979. He was also an avid photographer of nature and landscapes. He was an active member of Redeemer Lutheran Church. John was preceded in death by his parents, Bill and Alvina Paul, and four infant brothers. John is survived by his wife of 53 years, Grace Buchhorn Paul; son, Mark Paul and granddaughter, Melissa Paul, of Leander; daughter, Lori Paul of Cedar Park; and his beloved dog, Maggie; brothers, Leroy (Junell), and Sam Paul (Mary Pat); several loved nieces and a nephew; and a host of cherished friends.
