June 1992

Sixteen TARC members assisted at the Meridian retirement center after a fire. TARC held an amateur radio demonstration at St. Mary's school in Temple.

The bulletin reported that on May 18th **50** people checked in for the Monday Night Net.

June 1995

The Radio Amateur is:

CONSIDERATE: Never knowingly operating in such a way as to lessen the pleasure of others.

LOYAL: Offering loyalty, encouragement and support to other amateurs, local clubs and the American Radio Relay League, through which Amateur Radio in the United States is represented nationally and internationally.

PROGRESSIVE: With knowledge abreast of science, a well built and efficient station and operation beyond reproach.

FRIENDLY: With slow and patient operation when requested, friendly advice and counsel to the beginner, kindly assistance, co-operation and consideration for the interests of others. These are the hallmarks of the amateur spirit.

BALANCED: Radio is an avocation, never interfering with duties owed to family, job, school or community.

PATRIOTIC: With station and skill always ready for service to country and community.
