## FROM THE ARCHIVES

2014 bulletins will focus on the years 1971 through 1989.

May 1975

TARC helped with the Temple March of Dimes Walk-a-Thon.

May 1977

Santa Fe hospital has expressed an interest in working out an emergency communications plan. 22 people participated in a transmitter hunt. Donated prizes were a digital ham clock, mobile power mic, 1976 proof coin set and LP record albums donated by KTEM radio station.

May 1978

New club by-laws had TARC elect its first Vice President. Vernon Starnes W5WDW was elected.

May 1984

May meeting will have a segment on My Favorite QSL Cards. Bring your favorite cards to show off. Also bring your Handi Talkie and show off its features. TARC is working with state representative Bill Messer of Belton to get amateur radio equipment exempt from state sales tax.

May 1985

A code practice machine with punched paper tapes was donated to the club for possible code training needs. Editorial by Mike LeFan WA5EQQ on the future of TARC. Concerns were the graying of members and lack of young people getting interested in amateur radio.

May 1986

The Prairie Ship Liberty is coming to Temple, which is its only Texas stop. TARC was asked by the city of Temple to help with communications at the site.

May 1987

The autopatch on the .82 repeater has been modified so that all emergency code numbers now need a double star (\*\*) rather than just one star. The club's new Icom IC-28A 2 meter radio will be on display. NOTE: This radio was only retired from TARC's inventory a couple of years ago.

May 1989

Next meeting will have a Pro and Con discussion of "no code" licensing.
